As a result of this the only tolerably verifiable bust of any Jew from that time is the bust The Romans made of Flavius Josephus [4]. If we use Josephus' bust as our guide it is safe to say the average Joe in Palestine 2,000 years ago had mostly Caucasoid features. The Shroud of Turin depicts Christ as dolichocephalic and Caucasoid. According to The Good Book one of Jesus' ancestors was Jacob. Jacob's twin brother Esau had red hair, as probably did two other of Christ's ancestors the Kings David and Solomon [5-9].
